2026-2 Double Major Application Guidelines

Under the University Constitution and Regulations in Chapter 4, Section 3, Article 35 Academic Operations Regulation Chapter 6, Section 2, subsection 1 on Double Major

While studying their first major, this system offers students the opportunity to simultaneously pursue a second major, allowing them to earn two bachelor degrees upon graduation.

1. Eligibility

- 1) Applicants whose 1st major have already been designated are eligible to apply for double major**
- 2) Applicants should have registered for more than 3 semesters. (Transfer students can apply after completing a minimum of one semester at Korea University.)**
- 3) KU students who are currently registered for 2026-1 semester.**
 - a. Students currently attending (or planning to attend) any kind of international program (SEP/VSP, KU-GLP, internship etc) during the semester and summer(spring semester)/winter session(fall semester) may not apply for double major.
 - * Students participating in the KU-GLP program who do not request credit approval are eligible to apply for a double major.
 - b. Students who take a leave of absence (including leave during the semester) after submitting a double major application or after the announcement of acceptance results shall be disqualified from the selection process or deemed to have forfeited their double major admission.
 - * Required enrollment period for students in the applicable semester: Spring semester (March 1 - July 31)
 - * Students may take a leave of absence during the entry semester (the following semester) after acceptance into the double major.
- 4) Students who are already in second major (double major, interdisciplinary major, and student-designed major) are NOT eligible to apply.**
 - a. Students who would like to cancel the acceptance of double major(including interdisciplinary major, student-designed major) and apply for other programs should complete the withdrawal procedure before **May 11 (Mon), 2026**.
 - ※ Withdrawal procedure: Portal > Registration & Graduation > University Registration > 다중전공포기신청 > Submit Withdrawal Request

- b. Re-application to another second major(double major, interdisciplinary major, student-designed major) can **only be accepted once**.
- c. Failed applicants for double major(including interdisciplinary major, student-designed major) should pursue a single intensive major.

4. Selection Criteria and Student Quota

Selection Criteria	<p>1) Each department screens the applicants based on their academic performance. (Both first and second preference)</p> <p>2) Students with their 2nd preference may be considered if there are available spots.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Applicant's overall GPA from previous semesters (including F) are included in the application. • Department or Division may include interview or Statement of Purpose as part of their selection process, please refer to the Table below
Student Quota	<p>Number of successful applicants is determined by each department/division</p> <p>1. Each department may restrict the number of double major students, based on 150% of the department's regular student quota minus the number of intensive major students. However, departments may adjust this limit autonomously upon request.</p> <p>2. For departments within the College of Education, the number of students admitted to the double major program shall not exceed 100% of the department's regular quota.</p> <p>3. The number of students from the Seoul (Sejong) Campus who may pursue a double major at the Sejong (Seoul) Campus shall be limited to within 30% of the quota determined above.</p>

※ Students applying for the Department of Mathematics Education, Department of Computer Science and Engineering, or Department of Electro-Mechanical Systems Engineering must verify prior to application that they meet the detailed eligibility requirements, including the completion of prerequisite courses designated by each department.

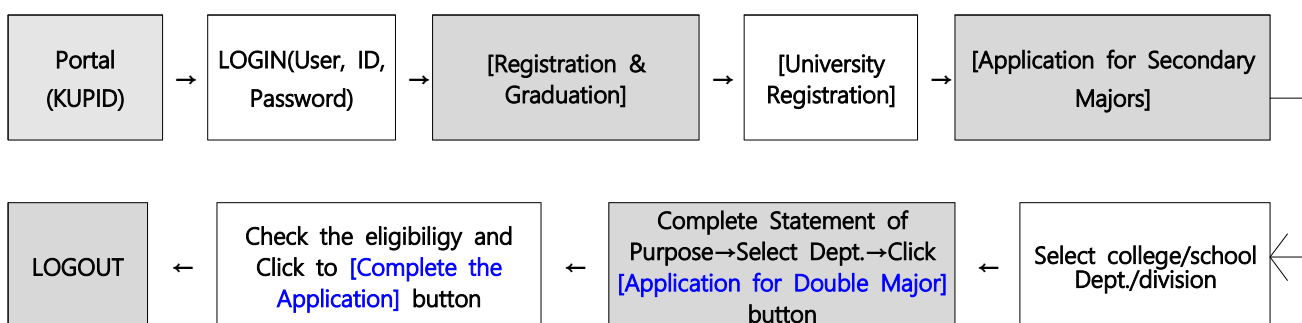

5. How to Apply



- ※ If a student does not wish to select 2nd preference, please select “NOT APPLICABLE”
- ※ Click [Application for Double Major] button to start application for double major. You must [click \[Complete the Application\]](#) to submit your application.
- ※ [Applicant can NOT make any changes after clicking ‘Complete the Application’](#). Please check all instructions carefully. **The deadline of application for double major is May 15(Fri) 17:00, 2026.** Please be advised that applicants should complete online application 1~2 hours before the

deadline. Applications cannot be submitted after the deadline, and any delays due to technical issues with an individual's computer will not be considered.

※ As for statement of purpose, student should write it directly at the Portal page(if required).

※ Please be advised to frequently save your work while writing the Statement of Purpose and ensure that you remain logged into the portal.

6. Instructions

- 1) Under the mandatory second-major policy implemented from the 2004 academic year, students are required to choose one of the following: intensive course of the first major, double major, interdisciplinary major, or student-designed major.(※ However, for transfer students admitted through academic transfer, the second major is optional) Current enrolled students who have already been assigned their first major and wish to apply for a double major must submit their application within the designated period.
- 2) Students pursuing an intensive course of the first major will automatically enter without a separate application process.
- 3) If students currently pursuing a second major (double major, interdisciplinary major, or student-designed major) wish to withdraw from their current second major and reapply, reapplication is permitted only once. If unsuccessful, they must complete the intensive course of the first major. To reapply, students must officially withdraw from their current second major through the portal system within the designated period (by May 11(Mon), 2026).
※ Withdrawal procedure: Portal > Registration & Graduation > University Registration > 다중전공포기신청 > Submit Withdrawal Request
- 4) If a student withdraws after being accepted into a second major, they will be automatically transferred to the intensive course of the first major. In this case, the required credits for the first major will increase, so students must carefully review the graduation credit requirements for the intensive course of the first major.

7. Guidelines for Double Major Completion

- 1) Double major courses which students have already completed before the approval of the application shall be recognized as double major credits. The approval of the credits will be subject to each department's academic regulations.

- 2) Double major students may graduate only after satisfying the graduation requirements established for both first and double major by their departments.
- 3) If students have fulfilled all graduation requirements for their first major (or double major) by the end of the 8th semester but have not completed the graduation requirements for their double major (or first major), graduation shall be deferred until the completion of the double major (or first major).
- 4) Upon satisfying the graduation requirements of both the first and double major, students shall be conferred with the bachelor's degree of each major.
- 5) For any questions related to the curriculum and graduation requirements please contact the relevant department or college.

8. Certificates and Degree Conferral

- 1) When certificates (graduation certificates and academic transcripts) are issued, both the first major and double major shall be listed.
- 2) A diploma will be issued listing both the first major and the double major.

Since the 2025 academic year, the Center for Academic Advising and Design has been offering academic advising to support students in exploring their majors and planning their career paths. Students are strongly encouraged to take advantage of these advising services before applying for their second majors.
